### What's New?

A lot, which is good news for a team that finished in the AFC West basement for the fourth time in five seasons. After tying for the NFL's worst record (2-14), the Chiefs overhauled both their roster and front office. John Dorsey replaces Scott Pioli as GM, Andy Reid takes over for Romeo Crennel as head coach and there are new coordinators on both sides of the ball: Doug Pederson and Bob Sutton. Alex Smith was brought in from San Francisco to give the Kansas City passing game a more capable triggerman, with Chase Daniel settling in behind him. Branden Albert, the team's franchise tag designee, will protect their blind side, while No. 1 overall pick Eric Fisher should provide an immediate upgrade up front. Dwayne Bowe got new money and newcomer Donnie Avery gives Smith another threat out wide. Defensively, cornerbacks Dunta Robinson and Sean Smith were added to bolster a unit that tied for the league's fewest picks (7).

### Valuemeter

While all eyes will be on Smith after the Chiefs totaled just eight passing TDs all of last season – fewest in the NFL since Oakland had seven in 2006 – running back Jamaal Charles could once again be the team's most valuable player. Kansas City spent a 3rd-round pick on Knile Davis for depth, but the electric Charles comes off a season that saw him rank fourth in the

league with a career-best 1,509 rushing yards. With Reid's new offense, the two-time Pro Bowler should be even more involved in the passing game to boot.

### Big Number: 1

The number of times the Chiefs scored more than 16 points over the final 12 weeks of 2012. They went 1-11 over that span.

### Team Philosophy

Reid's creativity and the hiring of consultant Chris Ault, an expert on the pistol, should give the Chiefs a fresh look on offense, particularly with the athletic Smith calling the signals. The team will be counting on more turnovers and 3-and-outs with Sutton's new attacking approach. In the end, Kansas City will have to score more and give up fewer points. Sounds obvious, but it had the league-worst offense (13.2 points) and defense (26.6) last season.

### Preseason Watch

There's certainly plenty to keep an eye on in Year 1 of the Reid regime. After an embattled end to an otherwise distinguished career in Philadelphia, Reid gets a fresh start – and seems to have some pieces in place to begin a turnaround.

Can he change the culture in Kansas City to that of a perennial playoff contender ala his early Eagles' days... or will the disappointment of his last two seasons in Philly follow him to Missouri? **FF**
